ARKANSAS RETREAT IS DEEPLY MOVING

<u>MEDITATION</u>

Is meditation a technique, a process, a concept or a spontaneous awareness that comes upon surprisingly when the mind is empty of its content and the energy of calmness contains the turbulence of chaos? It is very important to know what meditation is in reality and what it means in its broader connotation to the universality of the mind and the preliminaries of life. There are many concepts, practices, definitions, terminologies and applications of meditation in different religious groups and also among ardent advocates of relaxation and rehabilitation. In usage, meditation stands for certain induced or enforced activities of the mind such as concentration, thinking, reflecting, chanting, visualizing, maneuvering, measuring, recalling, etc. In recent years, meditation has "become" an essential feature of mysticism and psychism.

Is there a practical side of meditation which can be applied to every day life to make it less complex and more pleasant? There may be an answer, not in the techniques of meditation which are generally conditions and reactions governing the practice of meditation, but in the nontechnical inspirations which are not conditions and reactions, but dynamic movements and interactions overwhelming the mediocrity of the endangered mind. I say "endangered" because the human mind has become terribly destructive and whatever becomes destructive, destroys itself eventually. Paradoxically enough, human beings have lived and continued in this situation for thousands of years. The human mind has invented thousands of escapes. Some of these escapes are meaningful as long as confusion and chaos are considered normal. Others have no meaning whatsoever. Meditation, which is eternally present in the pure energies of the mind and the spirit as the transcendental fire of immensity and clarity, has also become an acceptable escape leading to inertia and egocentric

propensities. Meditation is practiced in the Orient as a means to a spiritual end. The practice of meditation, with its variety of techniques, may not lead to any expected results. But it is better to practice it in any form just to keep the mind out of mischief. If the practice becomes mechanical, it may lead to chemical interactions but not dangerous reactions. This is, in fact, a practical and positive contribution. Meditation practice may obviate the chaotic nature of the present day life. Meditation, to my knowledge, is not an ending process but an ever-creating, holy presence that eternally pervades the universal essence as law in itself. It is neither being nor becoming. It is just present eternally. It happens when the mind is pure and empty, and the consciousness revels in freedom. When it comes upon, one is eternally present. One is immense; one is immeasurable and one with the totality of the inscrutable Cosmic rhythm in which "this" vanishes and the "other" is no more. There is the sound, just the sound, the ever renewing music, the eternal dance sporting graciously with gay abandon and nothing else.

BRIEF IMPRESSIONS

OF A FIRST VISIT TO RANCHO ANCON by Rosemary Reagan

Talking leaves of massive cottonwoods shade Rancho Ancon's adobe structures and grounds. Actually, the leaves whisper their gentle vibrations carried by breezes to hammock loungers, yard workers, and patio dwellers. A gentleness about Rancho Ancon and its owners blends with the immaculately pure mountain air. Spotlights of morning sun encourage Shasta daisies, petunias,

tiger lilies and geraniums stationed near red brick walkways.

The newly decorated guestroom, a wonderful blend of white, pinks, browns, and blues, suggests an ancient history of itself with an adobe corner fireplace. It also demonstrates the modern energy of its owners, with freshly painted white walls, new flowered carpet and bedspreads -- and white lace curtains.

Bricked floors in Rancho Ancon's main hacienda lead the way to a place which blends cultures. Eastern sunshine from double doored windows shines on a Spanish tile coffee table of a Navajo woman on a pinto pony, herding sheep beside purple mountains. Massive hand carved furniture, wall paintings of the Buddha, St. Francis's statue over the adobe fireplace, and a hand painted screen including Shiva, Vishnu, Brahma and their consorts Parvati, Lakshmi, and Sarvasviti, blend religious heritage as well.

The meditation room features—on entering—a ten feet high, five feet wide mirror framed in carved mahogany, reflecting the room's spiritual essence. The altar, Buddha, Jesus the Christ, Mary, Quan Yin, share a place with other symbols of world spirituality. And, through windows behind the altar, again is a view of cottonwoods with their talking leaves, which whisper to you their message of the ages!

"The Dharma of man is an unconcerned movement of action in goodness."


